REPORTS FROM MAYOR, COUNCIL, TOWN MANAGER

1. Council Reporting (Training/Conferences/CEAC, Listening Teams, All Other Committees)

Councillors reported on the various committees, meetings, and activities they attended since the last regular council meeting and what they plan on attending in the coming weeks.

The Mayor then read out loud a proclamation that September 9, 2014 is Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Awareness Day.

The Mayor asked council for their approval to have either himself or Councillor Young attend the "Newcomers Canada Fair" being held September 13 and 14, 2014 in Toronto. This event is put on by Working Abroad Newcomers Network ("WANN") and has previously been held in Calgary and Vancouver. The mayor stated this event is to encourage people to move to our region to fill the large job gaps. He and Councillor Young are working with local businesses to get an inventory of the jobs that are available in our community. Kimberley Worthington, Economic Development & Housing Manager, is also attending, but the mayor feels it is important enough that a Councillor should also attend.
