Recreation Centre Modernization Vote

On October 20, 2025, Town of Hinton residents can vote on three options to modernize the Dr. Duncan Murray Recreation Centre. The vote will be held in conjunction with the General Municipal Election.

Options include: Maintain, Expand, or Build New. Total costs - including operating expenses for 25 years - range from \$109M to \$217M. Property tax increases range from an additional \$180 to \$600 per year or \$15 to \$50 per month on a \$400,000 residence. Depending on the option, upgrades would begin immediately or in ten years, once sufficient funds are saved.

Portions of the recreation centre are over 60 years old. 95% of the facilities are in fair to very poor condition. Learn more at hinton.ca/Engage



Water Meter Installation Progresses

The Town of Hinton has contracted Neptune Technology Group to install water meters at single-family and multi-residential properties. Residents will receive a letter from Neptune with a booking reference and instructions once installation begins in their area. Installation is mandatory under Bylaw No.2005, and free during the installation period. Appointments are flexible, including evenings and weekends, and take between 60 and 120 minutes. Meters will not be used for billing until March 1, 2026, allowing residents to monitor water usage in preparation for the change before billing begins. Learn more at hinton.ca/Engage
